Mildura Region - Australia



The Mildura region is highly resourced with numerous education and training facilities, ranging from early childhood development through to tertiary education providers.

Education and training facilities are important factors in making the decision to relocate a family or business.

Mildura's diverse range of options provides opportunities for residents and other students to continue on a path of lifelong learning and undertake training in skills shortage professions.

La Trobe University

As part of a multi campus network, the Mildura campus of La Trobe University currently has over 500 students. La Trobe University (Mildura Campus) offers undergraduate and postgraduate courses in Accounting, Arts, Business, Education, Graphic Design, Nursing, Health Science, Social Work and Visual Arts. Being a smaller campus, all students benefit from more one-on-one contact time with La Trobe staff. The courses have been designed to meet industry needs at regional, national and global levels. Monash University

Mildura Region Clinical School

In 2001 the Federal Government provided funding to nine Universities with Medical Schools to set up Clinical Schools in rural Australia. The purpose of the regional clinical schools is to provide rural exposure to students early in their clinical years, with the overall aim of attracting new medical graduates back to the rural communities to practice.

Secondary Colleges

Mildura has a number of secondary colleges, including Mildura Senior College which caters exclusively for students studying Years 11 and 12.

Some other secondary schools in the region offer Years 7 - 12, while most offer Years 7 - 10.

Schools in the Mildura region provide a high standard of education and many extra-curricular activities including sporting and artistic pursuits.

There is also the potential for a Trades Training School to be established in the Mildura region, which will be a collaboration of local secondary colleges to address skill shortages in trade areas.

Sunraysia Institute of TAFE

Established in 1979, the Institute offers students up to date and relevant courses, including nursing and childcare, that are a combination of theoretical and practical learning. Sunraysia Institute of Technical and Further Education (TAFE) has 4 campuses and 8,000 students are enrolled per year.

Some of the courses on offer are in areas of skills shortages such as horticulture, conservation and land management, irrigation, business, commercial cookery and hospitality, automotive and other trades.

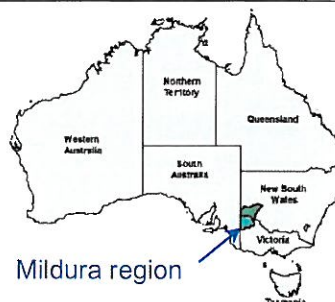
Mildura Region Trade Training Centre
