Mildura Region - Australia



Location Mildura is located on the Murray River in north-west Victoria on the border of New South Wales
550kms north-west from Melbourne | 400kms north-east of Adelaide | 1080kms west of Sydney

People

The Mildura region population is 58,976.

- 52,2049 in Mildura Rural City Council
- 6,767 in Wentworth Shire Council

Major towns in the region are Mildura (Victoria) and Wentworth (New South Wales).

The main industries in the region (in terms of employment) are Retail 13% | Health care & social assistance 12% | Agriculture 12%

The Mildura region grows the following percentage of Australia's produce:

98% of dried vine fruit	75% of table grapes
68% of almonds	48% of pistachios
24% of citrus	20% of wine grape crush
9% of asparagus	13% of carrots

Airport

Mildura airport is the busiest regional airport in Victoria, with 140 flights per week and 212,000 passengers in the 12 months to February 2014.

Mildura is accessible by air from Melbourne (70 minute flight time), Sydney (130 minutes), Adelaide (65 minutes), and Broken Hill (55 minutes).

Mildura is well serviced by a broad range of established professional and health, and family services

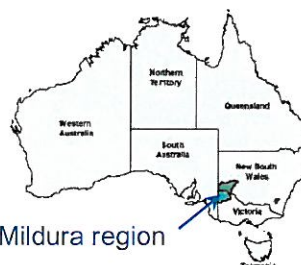
